



### JOHN L. "CHIP" MERRILL (OCTOBER 14, 1932 - APRIL 5, 2021)

"John Merrill wasn't a tall man, but he was a giant in many ways. He was a leader, conservationist, teacher, mentor, rancher, and advocate for the ranching industry and for conservation of the land." (Dr. Larry Butler)

For the many of us who were privileged to know Mr. Merrill, this statement is precisely accurate; and inadequate, all at the same time. To read the lengthy list of accomplishments worthy of including in his obituary, he was larger than a giant; and that excerpt does not include the "smaller" accomplishments, regardless of their impact.

A progressive man with a heart of gold, Mr. Merrill was celebrated on May 15, 2021, by over 180 friends and family members in the Will Rogers Memorial Center, in Fort Worth, Texas. The celebration was directed by Executive Vice President and Chief Executive Officer of Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers, Mr. Jason Skaggs. Attendees heard personal accounts and testimony to Mr. Merrill's first-rate character from Mr. Jim Link (former TCU Ranch Management Program Director), Mr. Pete Bonds (TCU Ranch Management Class of 1973), and Dr. Larry Butler (www.outontheland.com).

Listening to these influential men speak so kindly was inspiring, and one couldn't help but reflect and wonder, "How will I be remembered?"

Further testament to Mr. John Merrill's character and grit is how he took on the role of director with the Texas Christian University Ranch Management Program—he took a fledgling idea into a reality. Mr. Merrill took the helm of a program that had tragically just lost their leader (the first director of the program, Mr. Arthur Cortade) in a car accident on the East Texas field trip. At the beginning of his tenure, the program was held in the basement of the TCU education building and travel was in with four station wagons. Before his retirement, funds had been raised and a new building had been constructed for the program, complete with 36 seats, and five Suburbans for travel. Additionally, a night class was hosted with anywhere from 40-100 students present, depending on the current lesson.

Mr. Merrill constantly promoted what he believed in; and he believed in the TCU Ranch Management Program. He taught common sense and self-discipline, preaching the importance of punctuality and professionalism in dress, looks, and actions, regardless of the audience. Thus, the "three strikes" rule and mandatory suit and tie dress code were enforced for many years. He was a cheerleader for all who tried— constantly encouraging others to do your best in whatever you pursue, especially learning. He was always "firm, fair, and friendly" and a man of integrity... but rules were always to be followed and you had to "understand what NO meant."

Mr. John Merrill's character and ideals will stand the test of time. Many students have been impacted by the principles and practices and will continue his legacy for many years to come. Here are few of the learning points that Mr. Merrill lived by:

- "It's more important to know the questions, than to find out the answers."
- "Always have something to write with, something to write on, a pocket knife, and a handkerchief."
- "Make a flight plan and stick to it...until you need to make an adjustment."
- And most importantly, "Always be firm, friendly, and fair."
